Introduction

- In order that you can study some subjects in more depth in Year 9 we are asking you to choose 3 creative subjects and two languages to follow in year 9.
- The booklet contains details of all the courses available to you.
- Some of the subjects you decide not to follow in Year 9 will not be available to you when you make your GCSE choices in February of Year 9. We make decisions though case by case.

Choosing subjects

Do you enjoy the subject?

Students who enjoy their subjects tend to be the most successful. Remember that your decision should not be based on what your friends are choosing or who is currently teaching you – all that could change next year when there will be new teaching groups.

Do you need the subject?

Some of you may already have definite career plans. It is therefore essential that you choose your options to suit these paths. However, many of you will not have made decisions about your final choice of career so it is important that you keep your options open.




What will I be doing?


In Year 9 you will undertake a range of mini design and technology projects and short focus practical tasks. These would include but not limited to;

- The development of CAD skills,
- Technical drawing skills,
- Experimentation with a range of materials and processes; for example a design and make jewellery activity utilising polymers, timbers and metals.
- Mini electronics project,
- Graphics packaging project,
- Gain knowledge about the theory of design and manufacture, including new and emerging technologies.

Why choose art textiles?

This subject sits under the same subject umbrella as Fine Art and uses the same assessment criteria as Fine Art at GCSE level, the only difference being that final outcomes will be realised through a variety of different Textiles media.

If you enjoy being creative, want to increase your practical skills then **Art Textiles** is a great choice.

The skills you gain make it a great complement to other subjects. **Art and Textile design** is a way of seeing things and making sense of the world around you.

Why study Drama? Do you want to learn performance skills, perform plays and devised pieces, learn about stagecraft, work as part of a team and fulfil your creative potential? Then Drama is the option for you!



What will I study?

- * <u>Term 1:</u> You will learn the vocal and physical acting skills to help you perform and also a range of Dramatic techniques to help you practically realise your ideas. We will work on bringing a poem to life on stage, as well as creating and performing a devised montage piece on World War One. This will include writing your own letter from the front, learning and performing this as well as extracts of script.
- * <u>Term 2</u>: We study Scripted acting and perform extracts from the play "Our Day Out". This includes performing comedy improvisations based on school life and designing and creating your own puppets.
- * Term 3: We will devise and perform pieces based on the context of a 'Zombie Apocalypse!' You will learn about masks, costumes and make up design as well as the use of sound and props to enhance your performance.





* What I will study in Year 9?

- Students in Year 9 continue their reading of the Cambridge Latin Course in order to learn new grammatical structures. The stories involve:
- the eruption of Mount Vesuvius and the destruction of Pompeii, from which two important characters escape and travel to Britain.
- the Roman invasion of Britain, life in a Roman province far away from Italy, and the rebellion of the Iceni & Boudica
- life in Roman Egypt, the defeat of Antony and Cleopatra at the Battle of Actium, the culture of ancient Egypt which the Romans inherited, racial violence in the streets of Alexandria, and sacred cats

- * There is also the opportunity in Year 10 to take part in our very successful French, German and Spanish Exchanges in the language or languages, which you have chosen. Students always really enjoy this experience and often form life-long friendships with their exchange partners.

- You might not see your chosen career path being linked with knowing a language, however......
- Did you know that most universities have links with other universities in foreign countries, and it is possible to have a year abroad as part of a degree in other subjects, not just a language course.
- You can combine your French, German and Spanish with a variety of different areas, which you might be considering for the future: For example,
- Medicine, Law, Journalism, English, History, Maths, Music, Physics, Chemistry, PE, Biochem, Physio, Accountancy, Theatre, Business Studies, Biology, Sports Science, Sociology and Psychology – and so many more.....!!^(C). A year abroad plus a language combined with your study would make you stand out from all the other candidates!
- Or you could use your language skills, like many of our previous students, to show you are brilliant at learning a language and start a new one, such as Japanese, Chinese, Russian, Korean or Arabic!
