## Overview of the Entrance Examination

Dear Parents / Carers

Thank you for considering Clitheroe Royal Grammar School as the next stage in your son's or daughter's education. Clitheroe Royal Grammar School is based on firm values and traditions and provides not only outstanding academic opportunities, but also an environment where each student can develop essential life skills.

The school is a mixed, selective 11-18 Academy school rated as outstanding by Ofsted. Tuition is entirely free.

Entry to the school is by selection at our Entrance Examination. Places will be offered to those young people who, through the selection procedure, prove that they are suited to the type of education provided at Clitheroe Royal Grammar School. The approved admission number is 180 each year and pupils who are usually in their Year 6 at primary school are eligible to enter. The school is required to comply with the Lancashire Co-ordinated Scheme for secondary school admissions to Year 7. Under this scheme, only one offer of a school place will be made by Lancashire for admission to any secondary school including Clitheroe Royal Grammar School. Parents may express up to three preferences for admission to all maintained secondary schools. The priority in which parents express their preferences will be used to determine which one offer is made.



To gain entry to Clitheroe Royal Grammar School pupils must take the Entrance Examination. **This takes place on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> September 2026.** Parents who wish their son/daughter to take the entrance examination must complete a Clitheroe Royal Grammar School application form which can be found on our website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)). **This form will open on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2026 at 12.00 noon and must be completed by 12.00 noon on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2026. This will be the final date for acceptance of applications.**

Please note that all four Grammar Schools in Lancashire normally hold their entrance tests on the same day. However, not all Grammar Schools in Lancashire will do the same entrance tests.

## Overview of the Entrance Examination

Following the test parents will be informed as to whether their son or daughter has reached the required standard for entry to the school.

In addition to completing the Clitheroe Royal Grammar School application form, parents **must** complete online the Local Authority (LA) Common Application Form by **31<sup>st</sup> October 2026**.

Parents must list Clitheroe Royal Grammar School as one of their preferences if they want their son/daughter to be considered for a place. Both Lancashire County Council and Clitheroe Royal Grammar School operate an equal preference system. However, the preferences expressed by parents **will** determine which one offer is made.



It is important that parents understand that the system of allocation of school places by the Local Authority (LA) will mean that if, after applying the admissions criteria, a child appears on the eligible list of their *first preference* school, then this is the place that will be offered. A candidate with Clitheroe Royal Grammar School as a second or third preference, even if qualified by test score, cannot be offered a place if they are eligible for a school for which a higher preference has been indicated on the Common Application Form.

We advise parents / carers to ensure they have made themselves familiar with the advice on and processes relating to secondary admissions from their home Local Authority (LA). For those residing in Lancashire the Local Authority (LA) website is <https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/apply-for-a-secondary-school-place/>.

We advise parents / carers to ensure they have carefully read the 2027-28 Admissions Policy which is available on our website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)) and is also found later in this document.

The **Entrance Examination** will be held on **Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> September 2026** at the **Chatburn Road** site of the school and will consist of two papers, both of which are age weighted. The Entrance Examination papers will be provided by **Future Stories Community Enterprise Ltd (FSCE)**.

Both papers assess a candidate's application of knowledge and skills in English and Mathematics up to and including the Year 5 programme of study as detailed in the Primary National Curriculum ([https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/media/5a81a9abe5274a2e8ab55319/PRIMARY\\_national\\_curriculum.pdf](https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/media/5a81a9abe5274a2e8ab55319/PRIMARY_national_curriculum.pdf)).

- **Paper 1 contains English and Mathematics questions with multiple choice answer options.**
- **Paper 2 contains English and Mathematics questions where candidates respond with short written answers.**

## Timetable for Entry

Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2026

CRGS online admissions form goes live.

Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2026

Open Evening from 5.30pm to 7.30pm

This includes talks by the Headteacher on the admissions process. No appointment is necessary.

Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> September 2026

Lancashire Local Authority online application system goes live.

Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2026 12.00 noon

Closing date for application to CRGS. The online form must be completed by 12.00 noon on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2026 to ensure that your son/daughter is registered for the entrance exam. **Applications will not be accepted after this date.**

Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> September 2026

Entrance examination at CRGS. Pupils will have two papers, both of which test Mathematics and English.

Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2026

Parents will be informed by this date as to whether their son/daughter has reached the required standard for entry to the school. Please note the number of candidates reaching the required standard may be greater than the number of places available. Further details will be given at the open evening.

Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> October 2026

Local Authority closing date for applications. To be considered for a place Clitheroe Royal Grammar School must be listed as one of the three preferences on the Local Authority Common Application Form.

Monday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2027

The Local Authority will inform parents of their allocated secondary school place. CRGS will also write to parents at this time.

## Overview of the Entrance Examination

The closing date for applications is **12.00 noon on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2026**. **We will not accept applications received after this date.** We will confirm in writing/email that we have received your application form, inform you whether your address is considered to be immediate catchment, wider catchment or non-catchment and give specific details about the examination by Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2026. With this confirmation you will receive a candidate entry card which must be brought to the examination. **You should affix a recent passport style photograph to the entry card.** If you have not received this confirmation by Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> September 2026 please contact the school.

All pupils of the academic Year 6 at primary school are entitled to take the tests but must apply to the school by the application closing date. It is up to parents to decide whether or not they feel it is appropriate for their son/daughter to be entered for the Clitheroe Royal Grammar School test. Last year, in total, 458 candidates applied for 180 places.

The tests will take place at Clitheroe Royal Grammar School, Chatburn Road, Clitheroe, BB7 2BA on **Saturday morning, 26<sup>th</sup> September 2026 at 8.30/9.00 a.m. (staggered start)**. The tests should be finished by 12.30 p.m. All materials required for the examination will be provided. There will be a break at which students can have a drink and / or snack. If a student experiences any problems during the examinations we will take appropriate action to support them.

**Parents whose son/daughter has special educational needs or where there are special circumstances are advised to contact the school, in writing, well in advance of the examination and at the latest by Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2026. This will ensure that any additional arrangements can be made.**

**Please also inform the school in writing, whether your son/daughter is eligible for Pupil Premium funding or has ever had Free School Meals by Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2026. This is part of the over-subscription criteria.**

Parents will not be allowed into school on the morning of the examination due to restrictions on space. Where a candidate is too ill to take the examination, parents must telephone the school on 01200 423379 before 9.00 a.m. on the morning of the examination and, provided there is a note from a medical practitioner, alternative arrangements will be made. Alternative arrangements may also be made in the case of adverse weather conditions or accidents.

**If you feel that there is any issue which might have affected your son/daughter's performance in the Entrance Examination other than a medical condition, please submit evidence to the Headteacher in writing within 2 working days of the examination.**

Following the test parents will be informed as to whether their son/daughter has reached the required standard for entry to Clitheroe Royal Grammar School. The school is not required to make any comments on the results of the entrance examination. Please note that the number of candidates reaching the required standard may be greater than the number of places available. Further details will be given at the Open Evening regarding our over-subscription criteria.

## Frequently Asked Questions

Candidates will be required to take two papers these will be provided by **Future Stories Community Enterprise Ltd (FSCE) and are copyright**. Below are some frequently asked questions for prospective parents / carers in relation to the FSCE Entrance Test.

### **What is the FSCE Entrance Test?**

The FSCE (Future Stories Community Enterprise) entrance test is a set of test papers used by some grammar schools to evaluate candidates for entry into Year 7. It assesses a range of academic abilities, all inspired by (and not beyond) the Key Stage 2 National Curriculum taught up until the end of Year 5.

### **What subjects or skills are explored in the FSCE test?**

The FSCE test for this consortium explores the application of knowledge and skills in:

- **English:** assessing understanding of texts, and appropriate use of language. To identify candidates with a strong command of the written word, who can read easily, fluently and with good understanding.
- **Maths:** problem-solving, logical reasoning, and application of numeracy. To identify candidates whose fluency in the fundamentals of maths means that they are able to focus on grappling effectively with increasingly complex problems in context and with increasingly large integers.

There is no non-verbal reasoning in our tests as it is not taught as part of the Key Stage 2 National Curriculum so we do not believe it to be a fair aspect to assess.

### **How is the test different from other entrance tests?**

The FSCE test has been designed with the young person in mind. From familiar test layouts to accessible wording and content with a range of difficulty levels, all young people will be able to 'give it a go' based on their commitment to working hard at primary school. A mix of multiple choice, constrained response and creative writing tasks will be familiar to young people from their primary school work.

### **What assurance is there that my young person has been taught the FSCE test content?**

All of the tests only include Key Stage 2 curriculum content that will have been taught up until – and including – the end of Year 5.

### **Can my young person prepare for the FSCE test?**

Yes. Young people will benefit by:

- Working well at primary school with maximum attendance and engagement in all areas of school life;
- Reading widely and regularly, with a focus on meaning;
- Practicing mental arithmetic in real-life scenarios and problem-solving puzzles;
- Engaging in reasoning and logic games that require imagination;
- Using the official Familiarisation Guides which are on the school website.

There is no need for intensive tutoring and no need for spending hours on past papers or mock exams. There are no commercial 11+ books or past papers endorsed by FSCE. All relevant test information and sample questions are provided in our Familiarisation Guides.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **Will we be given practice papers or familiarisation materials?**

There are Familiarisation Guides on our website to help young people, parents and teachers understand the style and format of the questions. These resources are designed to be informative, provide familiarity, reduce anxiety and ensure fairness. No tutor, parent, website or company can claim to have any other knowledge about what the FSCE entrance will be like or contain.

### **How long is the test and how many papers are there?**

The structure can vary slightly but generally for this consortium:

- There are two separate papers;
- Each paper typically lasts 45–60 minutes;
- A break may be scheduled between papers.

Specific details will be provided by the school in advance of the test and further information can be found in the Familiarisation Guides on the school's website Admissions page.

### **How are the papers marked?**

Questions are scanned and marked automatically using Optical Mark Recognition technology, with expert humans verifying any inconsistencies, amended answers or questionable responses. The process is reliable and trustworthy. The raw marks in each paper are then standardised and adjusted to account for differences in the age of the candidates. The process of standardisation is a statistical adjustment to ensure both papers have the same average score (100) and a similar spread of results. This ensures that a low scoring performance in a difficult paper, for example, has equal merit with a high score in an easier paper. Standardisation also ensures both papers have the same weight in determining the overall performance of each candidate.

### **How are results used?**

The two standardised scores are added together to produce a candidate's overall score. It is this value that is compared to the 'required standard' for admission into Year 7. The required standard is determined each year by the Admissions Committee based on the performance of candidates in the Entrance Examination.

If the school is subsequently oversubscribed by candidates who have reached the required standard, it will apply its oversubscription criteria (as detailed in the Admissions Policy) until the Published Admissions Number (PAN) has been achieved. Only applications who achieve the required standard will be considered for admission to Year 7. Please note that attaining the required standard does not guarantee admission to the school.

### **How will we know if our young person has reached the required standard?**

Parents / carers will receive a letter by 12.00 noon on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2026. This letter will be emailed to parents / carers and a paper copy will also be put in the post.

## Frequently Asked Questions

The school is a mixed, selective 11-18 grammar school providing a free education. As an academy school, the governors are responsible for setting the school's admission arrangements. In common with state schools throughout the country, Clitheroe Royal Grammar School will be part of a co-ordinated local admission scheme. Details are provided below.

Traditionally the school has drawn its pupils not only from the catchment area (see Notes 2 and 3), but from other places within travelling distance.

### **I Admission of Students to Year 7 (September 2027 entry)**

#### **i) Admissions Number**

The number of intended admissions to year 7 is 180.

#### **ii) The Tests**

For eligible candidates (see Note 1) the entrance examination will consist of standardised tests. Further details about the nature of these tests is available within the admissions handbook, which is on our website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)).

The tests will be conducted at the school in the autumn term. Arrangements to take the tests will be announced in the local press and on the school website each year.

A candidate may only sit the entrance examination once.

Parents / carers who wish their young person to take the entrance examination, must complete the Clitheroe Royal Grammar School application form. This is available on the school website and must be completed online.

#### **iii) Admission Criteria and Over-subscription**

Once the tests have been marked parents / carers will be informed whether their child has reached the required standard. Pupils will need to show that they have the ability to benefit from the education provision of the school by reaching the required standard, although this will not guarantee a place if the number of pupils achieving this score exceeds the number of places available.

**The school will not distinguish between candidates on grounds of gender, race, nationality, national origin, ethnic origin, disability, faith or denominational background.**

Candidates reaching the required standard who have a current Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming Clitheroe Royal Grammar School on the EHCP will be offered a place.

Clitheroe Royal Grammar School has a planned admission number for each year of 180. If the number of applicants reaching the required standard is less than 180, then all of these applicants will be deemed 'eligible'.

If the number reaching the required standard is greater than 180 and the school is therefore over-subscribed, then the school will rank the applicants who have reached the required standard according to the following admissions priority criteria:

- 1) Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted (see Appendix 1, Note 7)
- 2) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the immediate catchment area and who qualify for Pupil Premium\* funding at the time of registering to take the Entrance Examination.
- 3) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the immediate catchment area.
- 4) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the wider catchment area and who qualify for Pupil Premium\* funding at the time of registering to take the Entrance Examination.
- 5) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the wider catchment area.
- 6) Candidates whose permanent residence is outside the catchment area and who qualify for Pupil Premium\* funding at the time of registering to take the Entrance Examination.
- 7) Candidates whose permanent residence is outside the catchment area.

\*If a candidate qualifies for Pupil Premium funding or has ever qualified for Free School Meals, parents should inform the school in writing, prior to the Entrance Examination.

Candidates within over-subscription categories 2 - 7 will be ranked according to ability as demonstrated in the testing process.

In the event of equal scores within over-subscription categories 2 - 7, the final determining factor will be the proximity of the child to the school (see Note 4).

In the case of over-subscription, a confidential waiting list will be drawn up. This waiting list will be maintained for the academic year of admission. Position on the waiting list will be on the basis of ability. Where more than one candidate is at the same position on the list, priority will be given in the same order as over-subscription categories 2 - 7 and then to the individual nearest to the school (see Note 4).

Until the 31<sup>st</sup> of December in year 7, if a candidate withdraws, their place will be offered to the highest placed applicant on the waiting list.

#### iv) Further Information

For those candidates who have some inconsistency in scores and / or are borderline for admission, further information may be requested from the primary school subject to parental consent.

#### v) Co-ordinated Admissions Policy

The school is required to comply with the Lancashire Co-ordinated Scheme for secondary school admissions to year 7 (see Note 5). Under this scheme, only one offer of a school place will be made by Lancashire for admission to any secondary school including Clitheroe Royal Grammar School. Parents may express up to three preferences for admission to all maintained secondary schools. The priority in which parents express their preferences will be used to determine which one offer is made.

**It is important that parents understand that the system of allocation of school places by the Local Authority (LA) will mean that if, after applying the admissions criteria, a child appears on the eligible list of their *first preference* school, then this is the place that will be offered. A candidate with Clitheroe Royal Grammar School as a second or third preference, even if they have reached the required standard, cannot be offered a place if they are eligible for a school for which a higher preference has been indicated on the LA Common Application Form.**

#### (vi) Assessment of Candidates moving into the Area

Parents or guardians of candidates for year 7 who move from another area of the country into the vicinity of the school (whether inside the catchment areas or not) after the closing date for the submission of the Clitheroe Royal Grammar School application form, may apply to the school for them to be assessed.

During the period from the time of the examination to the end of the first term in year 7, the assessment will follow a similar pattern to that used for the entrance examination. If the candidate reaches a level comparable to students who have already been admitted and no places are available, the candidate's name will be placed on a confidential waiting list, ranked according to our oversubscription criteria. Please also see note 6.

### Summary of the Application Process for the Admission of Students to Year 7

1. The application form to take the Clitheroe Royal Grammar School examination must be completed online and submitted by the school's closing date. This application form is available on the school website.
2. The examination is held in the autumn term.
3. Parents / carers will be notified as to whether their child has reached the required standard sufficiently before the closing date for the completion of the Local Authority (LA) Common Application Form online. We advise that parents / carers wait for this notification from Clitheroe Royal Grammar School before completing the LA Common Application Form online.
4. Parents / carers complete the LA Common Application Form online. Parents who wish their child to be considered for a place at Clitheroe Royal Grammar School must list the school as one of their three preferences.
5. The LA will post notification of allocations as per their schedule. At the same time in the spring term Clitheroe Royal Grammar School will also email offers of places to successful candidates.

Parents will be required to confirm to their LA within 14 days, if they do not wish to accept a place offered.

6. Parents / carers whose child has been offered a place at Clitheroe Royal Grammar School will be asked to confirm their acceptance of the place.

### II In-Year Admissions

An in-year admission is the process of applying for a school place during the school year. This is normally into years 8 – 10, or for year 7 from January onwards (the school is required to maintain its year 7 waiting list, as a minimum, up until the end of December).

CRGS will only consider applications to the age-appropriate year group for the student.

Parents who wish to transfer their child from another school into CRGS should contact the school via [admissions@crgs.org.uk](mailto:admissions@crgs.org.uk). The in-year admission process is managed by the school. Parents are required to complete the in-year application form, which is available from the school website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)). Upon receipt of an application form your child will be placed on the in-year applications list until a place in the relevant year group becomes available. Until a place is available, the school will be unable to progress the

matter any further as admitting an additional child would prejudice the provision of efficient education or efficient use of resources for students currently attending the school.

Parents have the legal right of appeal against this decision.

All appeals must be made in writing. The appeal form is available from the school website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)).

Where a place is available, an age-appropriate entrance examination will be prepared and pupils on the in-year applications list will be invited to sit it.

The children of parents who have made an in-year application may sit more than one in-year entrance examination within one year, subject to places being available.

Candidates reaching the required standard who have a current Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming Clitheroe Royal Grammar School on the EHCP will be offered a place.

Pupils must reach the appropriate standard in order to be considered for a place. Where more pupils pass the examination than there are places, the applications will be ranked and prioritised as follows:

- 1) Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted (see Appendix 1, Note 7)
- 2) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the immediate catchment area and who qualify for Pupil Premium\* funding at the time of registering to take the Entrance Examination.
- 3) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the immediate catchment area.
- 4) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the wider catchment area and who qualify for Pupil Premium\* funding at the time of registering to take the Entrance Examination.
- 5) Candidates whose permanent residence is within the wider catchment area.
- 6) Candidates whose permanent residence is outside the catchment area and who qualify for Pupil Premium\* funding at the time of registering to take the Entrance Examination.
- 7) Candidates whose permanent residence is outside the catchment area.

In the event of equal scores within over-subscription categories 2 - 7, the final determining factor will be the proximity of the child to the school (see Note 4).

The successful candidate(s) will normally be expected to take up the place within the following two weeks. If they are unable to do so, the place(s) will be offered to the next candidate(s) on the list who has/have reached the required standard.

All applicants have a right to appeal this process. Formal appeals documentation is available on the school website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)). All communications relating to appeals should be in writing.

### III Admission of Students to the Sixth Form

Admission to the Sixth Form at Clitheroe Royal Grammar School (CRGS Sixth Form) includes Clitheroe Royal Grammar School Year 11 students who fulfil the published entrance criteria and the criteria below and students new to the school. Applications for admission to the school's Sixth Form are welcome from all Year 11 applicants.

Details of requirements are published each year in the Sixth Form Guide which is available on the school website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)). These include a general requirement and specific subject requirements.

The school has a target figure of 235 students from outside the school to join existing Clitheroe Royal Grammar School students who wish to continue into the Sixth Form each year.

Students must submit their online application form. They will then be invited to take part in an Options Meeting, which is a one-to-one informal discussion with a member of staff about their A Level subject choices.

Students must submit their online application form by the published closing date in order to be eligible for entry. However, applications received after the closing date will be considered. Students making late applications will be designated a "late applicant" and in the case of over-subscription will be treated as a separate category (see below).

Where eligible applications exceed the number of places available, the following admissions priority criteria will be used to allocate places:

- 1) Candidates reaching the required standard who have a current Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming Clitheroe Royal Grammar School on the EHCP will be offered a place.
- 2) Looked after children or a child who was previously looked after, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special guardianship order or those children who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted (see Appendix 1, Note 7)
- 3) All students who applied before the published deadline. If there is oversubscription within this category, proximity to the school will be applied (see Note 4)
- 4) All students who applied after the published deadline. If there is oversubscription within this category, proximity to the school will be applied (see Note 4)

Students who move into the area after the published closing date and who wish to apply to join the Sixth Form at Clitheroe Royal Grammar School are advised to contact the school at the earliest opportunity so that their application can be considered if space allows.

CRGS Sixth Form reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a place if:

- It was made in error
- Parents / students fail to respond to the offer of a place within a reasonable period of time
- Parents / students decline the offer of a place
- It is established that the offer of a place was obtained through fraudulent or misleading application

Any student refused entry has a right of appeal.

#### **IV Appeals Procedure**

A parent or carer may appeal against the decision of the Admissions Authority for non-admission.

The appeal process is entirely separate from the allocation of places under the admission arrangements.

Places given on appeal are in addition to those already offered.

Parents of candidates who have not been allocated a place can obtain an appeal form from the school website ([www.crgs.org.uk](http://www.crgs.org.uk)) after formal notification of places by the local authority or for in-year admissions or admissions to CRGS Sixth Form notification by the school. These must be completed and returned to the school within 20 school days of notification.

The Appeals Panel is constituted in accordance with the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 and all members are independent of the school and of the Local Authority. Its decisions will be binding on the Admission Authority and on the parents.

Consideration by the Appeals Panel will be in two distinct stages:

- i) The Factual Stage, when the Panel decides whether the admission arrangements have been properly applied and, separately, whether prejudice would be caused to the efficient education of children in the school by reason of increased numbers. If prejudice is proved the Panel must move to:
- ii) The Balancing Stage, when the Panel exercises its discretion, balancing between the degree of prejudice to efficient education, which would result from admitting the child, and the strength of the parent or guardian's case before arriving at a decision that is binding on both the Admission Authority and the parent.

Appendix 1

### Explanatory Notes

- Note 1** Eligible candidates are those whose 11th birthdays fall between 1 September and 31 August inclusive, in the twelve months immediately preceding entry the following September. Children whose 10th birthdays fall between 1st September and the last day of February of their National Curriculum year 5 and who are of outstanding ability for their age, may also be considered for a place. This will only be with the unreserved and strong recommendation of the child's Primary School Headteacher. Other applicants outside the normal age group will be considered carefully on the basis of the circumstances of each case.
- Note 2** To establish residential status in the school's immediate and wider catchment areas requires that the family permanently reside within the designated area shown in Appendix 2 or Appendix 3 before the closing date for applications. Permanent residency is defined as owner occupancy or long-term letting contract of a residential property where a current driving licence is held and the appropriate council tax is paid by the occupier (evidence may be required eg copy of driving licence, council tax bill and mortgage agreement or letting contract). In the case of a recent change of address, additional evidence will be required. Families whose first home is outside the immediate or wider catchment areas and/or who are only living in short-term rented property or temporarily with friends or relatives in the area will be deemed to live outside the catchment area.
- Where a pupil lives with one parent for part of the week and the rest of the week with the second parent, only one address can be used for application. This will normally be (a) where the child lives for most of the school week and the address from which the child travels to/from school and (b) the address to which Child Benefit is paid.
- Note 3** If it is subsequently discovered that an application contains a falsely claimed or dated address in the catchment areas and/or any other false information, then any offer of a place will be withdrawn.
- Note 4** Nearest will be defined in terms of straight line distance between the candidate's home front door and the front entrance of the school; the Chatburn Road site in the case of applicants to years 7 to 11 and the York Street site in the case of applicants to the Sixth Form. In the event of a tied distance measurement between address points, a random draw will determine which address(es) receive the offer(s).
- Note 5** Details of Lancashire's scheme may be found at [www.lancashire.gov.uk](http://www.lancashire.gov.uk) under 'School Admissions' in the A-Z search.
- Note 6** For parents who are relocating to the area and who are unable to arrange for their child to take the entrance examination in the normal way, it is necessary to complete both of the following:
- 1) The online CRGS application form. This must be completed in order to arrange for the necessary assessment to take place.
  - 2) The Local Authority's Common Application process stating 3 preferences. This must be returned to the Area Pupil Access Team of your Local Authority. The Local Authority will consider the 3 preferences equally, in liaison with other admissions authorities. The offer of a place will be made by the Local Authority.
- Note 7** Looked after children includes children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order, or special

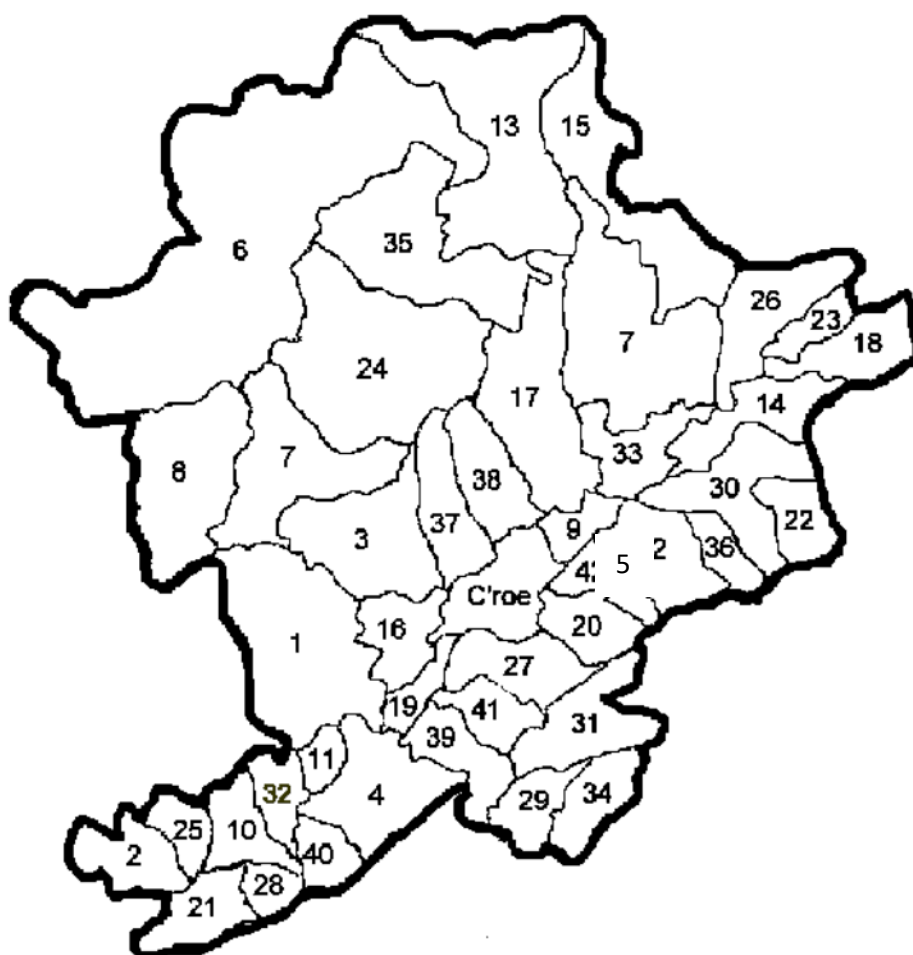

guardianship order or those children who appear [to the school] to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).
